IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN

You may have noticed an empty return envelope in your newsletter this month. January is the month when we collect voluntary contributions to the club. For those who have already contributed, we appreciate you. For those considering becoming a contributing member, the funds are used to mail our newsletter, maintain our website, host a booth at the Germantown Festival, and host our annual All American Picnic. Individual memberships are \$25 per year, and Family memberships are \$35 per year.

WANT TO GO TO MILWAUKEE?

This year the DNC will be held in Milwaukee the week of July 13th. If you want to go, hotels are plentiful (and much cheaper) in Chicago, and it is an easy day trip up I-41 to experience the sights and sounds outside the arena. That could be you in the foreground of MSNBC or CNN as they broadcast from the streets.

Or, do you want to be a delegate? There's work and strategy involved, but the experience is extremely rewarding. Detailed information is available on the TNDP website – www.tndp.org, but here's a brief synopsis. 1) File Candidacy declaration with TNDP by noon on Feb 20th. You need to declare for a candidate. 2) Vote in the March 3rd primary. 3) Attend your County Convention on March 7th. Bring lots of friends and neighbors to become selectors because you'll need their votes. 4) You and your Selectors attend your Congressional Convention on March 20th where the actual delegates will be elected.

District 8 elects 4 delegates and District 9 elects 7 delegates. The number and gender of delegates assigned to each candidate isn't

determined until after the Primary. Be aware that it's going to be a tough year to become a delegate, due to the wide field of candidates and the few slots available. Remember that even candidates who have dropped out or suspended their campaigns may still be on the ballot.

And remember, although we all have our preferences for President, the critical task is to unite and elect a Democrat. We can recover from 4 years, but 8? Questionable.
