### **BECOMING A DNC DELEGATE**

Every 4 years the Democrats hold their nominating convention and some number of delegates are chosen from the Democratic base. With some planning, hard work, and luck, you could be one of the people elected by your peers to represent Tennessee in Philadelphia this summer. In order to be a delegate, you must file a form with the TNDP stating who you will be supporting. The forms are available from the website [TNDP.ORG](http://TNDP.ORG). Forms must be filed by noon on Feb 19th.

Once you file, you must attend 2 conventions. The County Convention, March 4<sup>th</sup>, will elect people to attend the March 19th District Convention. Locations will be announced shortly.

To be elected as a National Delegate, you need to bring your friends and neighbors who live in your same Congressional District to vote for you. You also need to reach out to other people who want to be National Delegates to build a slate where you mutually support each other. Congressional District 8 gets 5 delegates, District 9 gets 7 delegates plus 1 alternate. These delegates will be split among the presidential candidates based on vote totals in the Congressional District.

All the information is available on the TNDP website. It takes a lot of work, but there is no feeling quite like being there when they call Tennessee and Mary Mancini announces, "The great state of Tennessee, home to Andrew Jackson and Al Gore, proudly casts its votes for the next President of the United States ...."
